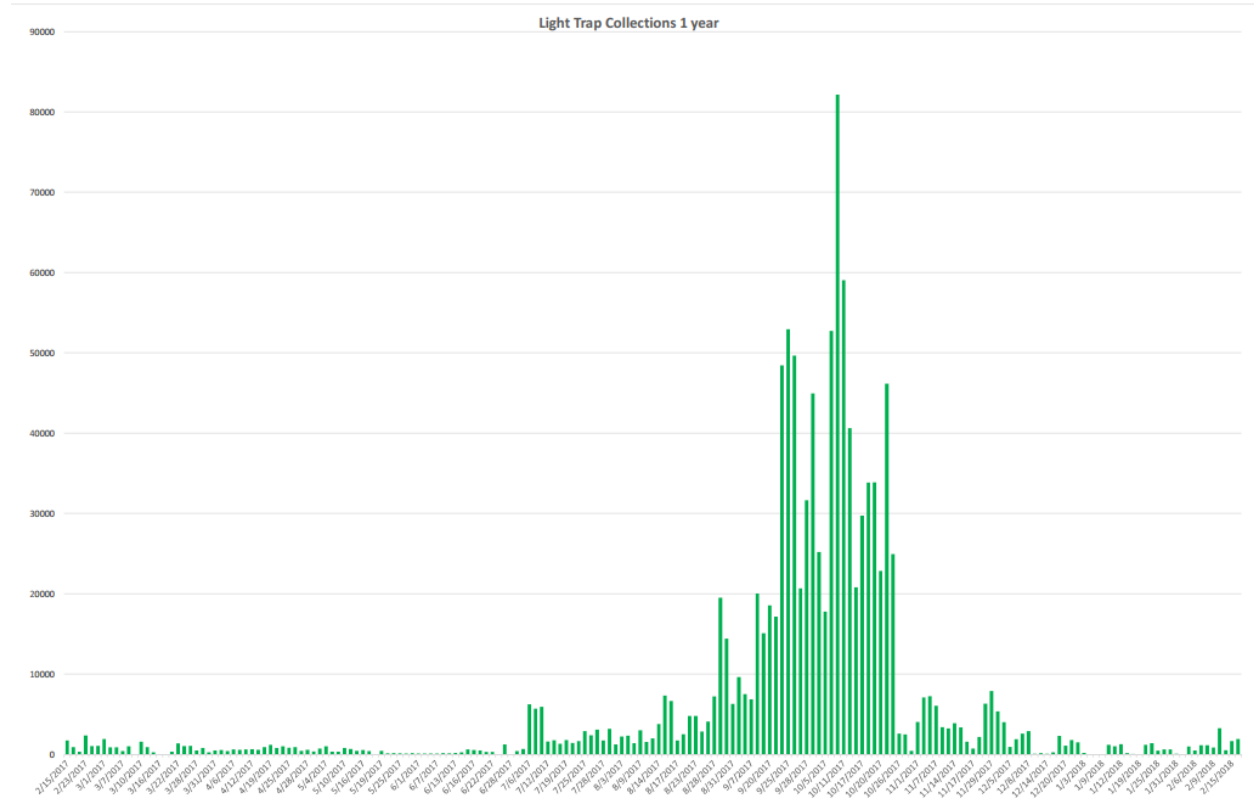


Week of 2/12/2018 Operations Update

This week saw a return of warmer temperatures that allowed for more mosquito activity. Mosquitoes don't go away during the winter. Some species lay eggs that are dormant until the next rain or tide that provides standing water for them to complete their life cycle. Other species either continue to breed in standing water, albeit at reduced rates, or can remain in the larval stage for the winter months or rest as adults in the insect version of hibernation, called diapause.



Adult surveillance efforts showed significant populations of *Culex* and *Anopheles spp.* The map below indicates the areas sprayed. Blue zones were sprayed at night after 10 pm, yellow zones were sprayed in the morning after 2 am.
